#### 3. Delegations

## 3.1 Request for Delegation by Stratford Affordable Housing Alliance and Receipt of Petition

Motion by Councillor Burbach

# THAT Niki Andre, representing Stratford Affordable Housing Alliance, be heard.

#### Carried

A video delegation from Stratford Affordable Housing Alliance (SAHA) members Leigha McCarroll, Damilare Woleye, Tanner Bergsma and Niki Andre was played highlighting the following:

Leigha McCarroll;

- noted data from the Stratford Ontario 2025 Housing Needs Assessment including housing costs compared to incomes and housing stock compared to housing needs;
- seniors, young workers and families getting priced out of Stratford;
- housing being the foundation of health, dignity and economic stability;
- requested the City provide a publicly accessible inventory of all City owned lands and properties; and
- across Canada, transparency and land availability being a first step in enabling innovative and affordable solutions.

Damilare Woleye;

- requested the creation of a land bank that records all City owned properties for the use of affordable housing;
- there being an unprecedented housing crisis across Canada;

- Stratford being home to an arts community who increasingly cannot afford to live in Stratford;
- people increasingly making decisions they are not comfortable with for affordable living;
- a land bank allowing for organizations and citizens to partner to build affordable housing;
- private market solutions not being long term; and
- the most difficult part of building being cost of land.

Tanner Bergsma;

- noted silent shame coming with poverty;
- residents being priced out of Stratford;
- requested the following:
  - a public inventory of City owned land;
  - a commitment to a land bank that the community can access for lasting affordable housing;
- housing being the law; and
- requesting partnership not charity.

Niki Andre, Co-founder and Director, SAHA;

- City owned land not yet having been compiled into a publicly available database;
- two Requests for Proposal (RFP) having been issued January 2025 for two parcels of City owned Land;
- details regarding the award of the RFP's and the proposals;
- the Stratford Official Plan (OP) being under review;
- requested the 2019 OP definition of Affordable Housing be retained;
- noted housing costs not to exceed 30% of a households gross income;

- the provincial definition considering housing affordable if it costs up to 80% of market value;
- noted these definitions not aligning;
- requested the following;
  - the delivery of a publicly accessible inventory of City owned land and property; and
  - the creation of a land and property bank before finalizing, funding or incentivizing any new developments that involve City owned assets in Stratford.

Discussion occurred on this matter between Sub-committee, staff and Niki Andre. Highlights of the discussion included the following;

- discussion regarding the referenced RFP's;
- a member asked if there is a practice of releasing publicly owned land in other municipalities;
- staff noted the City lands able to be developed being few;
- a public land database not yet having been created due to lack of resources and competing priorities;
- City mapping being done through the Geographic Information System (GIS) and posted online by a separate division from Planning;
- the list of parcels having been evaluated and brought to Council attention;
- the inventory being slivers, reserves, not able to be developed or owned for purpose of development with the list not being vast;
- the delegation requesting the inclusion of properties or any land owned by the City including un-serviced land be in the land inventory;
- a member noted the RFP's being an opportunity to add to affordable housing stock and not increase taxes through servicing with increases in taxes possibly adding to the housing crisis;

- the delegation noted the crisis having begun 30 years ago with a contributing factor being all government levels pulling out of land development;
- the delegation noted community land trusts being in perpetuity forever; and
- a Member noted the definition of 'Affordable' being with staff for review.

Discussion on this matter occurred between Sub-committee and staff. Highlights of the discussion included the following;

- staff clarified the parcels of land not categorized by zoning;
- data for a public list to be compiled to include the size of a parcel noting some land being 1 foot reserves, when a parcel was acquired, if serviced, if located in flood plain control or regulated area;
- the management of City owned lands having been moved to invest Stratford;
- the managing of an online list requiring resources with the City often acquiring and disposing of land through development process;
- Council having been actively involved in dealing with housing options for City owned lands;
- a Member commented the City not sitting on unused properties and asked if there are City buildings not being used to full potential;
- staff noted a fulsome review including this, Asset Management, short and long term financial implications, including studies can be done and to require time, effort and resources;
- a member noted other municipalities having apartments built above fire stations and transit stations with Council actively looking for solutions and having asked staff where units can be built;
- investStratford staff noted a land inventory being a list of available land; and

• noted a land bank implying land be held for a mission based outcome with a set of terms and guidelines.

#### Motion by Councillor Burbach

THAT the development of a publicly accessible inventory of all city-owned property and land and the creation of a land bank for all available City owned properties be referred to staff.

THAT the petition from Stratford Affordable Housing Alliance regarding the development of a publicly accessible inventory of all city-owned property and land and the creation of a land bank for all available City owned properties, be received.
