**Sub-committee Discussion:** The Director of Social Services provided the following highlights from the department update:

- the update being reflective of December 2024;
- Children Services having an increase in the number of children on the waitlist;
- the Homelessness Report having a decrease of 6 individuals experiencing homelessness to 138;
- the Housing Report having the number of households on the centralized waitlist decrease by 8 families to 590;
- Ontario Works having a decrease to 813 active caseloads;
- staff working on a variance review for the last quarter of 2024;
- at the January 14 meeting a Councillor requested staff review highlighting Stratford centric statics in the updates;
- staff indicating this is possible in most cases but not possible on the Homelessness Report as this population is transient; and
- staff to include this information in upcoming updates.



Arguably, the most impactful factor is the lack of affordable housing nationwide.






Percentage of caseloads with employment earnings




